Position overview

FOOD FOR HIS CHILDREN is a Christian organization working to eradicate extreme poverty in rural Tanzania. We are seeking a strategic and analytical individual for day-to-day program and administrative planning, direction and collaboration with the Tanzania Director, US Executive Director and the overall organization.

The Operations Manager is responsible for the day to day administrative, operational and financial support of the organization; analyzing effectiveness; long-term strategic planning; ensuring legal and governance compliance; evaluating, developing and implementing processes, procedures and policies to further the mission and vision; and managing personnel. The Operations Manager reports directly to the Tanzania Director of Partnership and program development. The goal of the Operations Manager position is to secure the functionality of the business to drive extensive and sustainable program impact.

Position overview

Food for His Children is seeking a highly motivated individual to fill the combined role of Accountant and Administrative Assistant. The successful candidate will be responsible for managing financial transactions, maintaining accurate records, and providing administrative support to ensure the smooth operation of our organization. Proficiency in QuickBooks accounting software is required for this role.

Responsibilities:

Accounting roles (60%)

- Oversee financial performance and risk profile while ensuring that all of regulatory obligations are met
- Oversee the Organization's fiscal activity, including budgeting, reporting, and auditing
- Monitor budgets and expenditures, contribute to budget planning and revision.



- Ensure the financial transactions are authorized, recorded, filed with adequate supporting documentation, and maintained.
- Reconcile transactions on computer and bank statements and ensure that all accounts balance
- Handle day-to-day financial transactions, including accounts payable, accounts receivable, and payroll processing.
- Monitor invoices, money handling procedures, accounting, bill payment and bank processes
- Implement operating cost controls in the areas of staffing, supplies, purchased services, etc. and introduce tactical initiatives to address losses.
- Liaise with and review budgets and expenditure as necessary
- Preparing payroll, filing payroll returns, and making payments of all payroll deductions.

- Prepare monthly financial reports, including income statements, balance sheets, and cash flow statements.
- Assist in budget preparation and monitoring, ensuring compliance with donor requirements, organizational and accounting policies.

Position overview

As a Field Officer at Food for His Children (FFHC), you will serve as a key liaison between our organization and the beneficiaries we support. Your role encompasses a diverse range of responsibilities aimed at providing holistic support to families in rural Tanzania, with a focus on case management and community engagement through family visits and community meetings.

This position requires travel by motorcycle in remote villages. Applicants need a motorcycle license or must be willing to travel by Electric bicycle to complete their duties.

Responsibilities:

- Discipleship: provide individual teaching of D4D principles and Biblical values to help individuals grow in their relationship with Jesus and to understand who they were created to be and how their role fits with the rest of their family and community. Demonstrate Christ-like behavior in all areas of life in order to be a role model for others.
- Case management of FFHC families to disciple, encourage and equip them to become all God created them to be.
- Prepare monitoring schedules for families and evaluate success indicators, and assist families with setting goals and steps to attain them, providing hands-on assistance when appropriate.
- Meet regularly with families to evaluate and monitor progress of stated goals; progress towards 16 Points of a Healthy Home; goat care and farming practices, family food security and assist with problem solving where needed. Complete case notes for every visit or attempted visit with a family.



- Coach families in processing how to determine and address the challenges to attaining their goals and provide additional assistance as needed, and weekly write a story about a participant to show their challenges, successes and about their life.
- Document all contacts with participants in appropriate files and enter family information in the database, make this information accessible to US FFHC for marketing/donor relation purposes, and attend meetings with the project sites to discuss successes and challenges and means to overcome the challenges.
- Assess the needs of the client and the client's family and arrange, coordinate, monitor, evaluate, and advocate for services to meet the specific client's needs
- Conduct family interviews upon acceptance into the program and annual reviews on their program enrollment anniversary month.
- Complete a goal plan with each family based on their goals and goals required to fulfill contract requirements
- Conduct family assessment annually and provide hands-on assistance in areas they are struggling with, if needed.
- Oversee school involvement program with Food for His Children families
- Maintain separate files for every family and ensure all records are kept according to activity done in a specific folder and that records are entered into FFHC database in a timely manner.
- Create family and child stories for fundraising
- Ensure formation of saving groups in each project site and attend savings group meetings to develop relationship with the group at least monthly
- Ensure all families comply with Food for His Children contract terms and conditions
- Participate in assigned department work as required

Position overview

A trainer has a vital role in empowering families and communities through education and skill development. Your primary responsibility will be to deliver engaging training sessions on health and environment, entrepreneurship, and agricultural practices, aimed at enhancing the well-being and self-sufficiency of FFHC beneficiaries.

This position requires travel by motorcycle in remote villages. Applicants need a motorcycle license or must be willing to travel by Electric bicycle to complete their duties.

Responsibilities:

Teaching:

• Deliver Health and Environment training sessions, emphasizing the importance of the 16 points of a healthy home through practical demonstrations of hygiene and sanitation practices.



- Conduct Entrepreneurship workshops covering topics such as savings, financial management, and marketing skills, while encouraging families to join savings groups.
- Provide leadership and discipleship training to project and site leaders, fostering personal and community development.
- Instruct families in the Farming Foundations curriculum, Farming God's Way and assist them with Heifer Raising Goats for Milk and Meat curriculum.
- Educate families on proper record-keeping for goat milk production, breeding, health, and veterinary care, offering one-on-one training as needed.

Plan, Organize & Coordinate:

- Plan and organize training sessions, ensuring high enrollment of targeted recipients twice per year.
- Develop training syllabus for each session and maintain electronic copies for future reference.
- Collaborate with other departments to create additional training curricula.
- Notify all relevant stakeholders, including families, site leaders, village and church leaders, and FFHC departments, of upcoming training dates.
- Supervise the roles of the Health and Environment & Entrepreneurship departments.
- Conduct door-to-door visits to gather feedback from families following each training session at least once or twice per quarter.
- Coordinate youth programs focusing on entrepreneurship, health and environment, savings, leadership, and Farming Foundations.
- Work with experts and third parties to develop comprehensive training content covering FFHC topics.
- Ensure all necessary tools, materials, and equipment for training sessions are available at least once a week prior to the scheduled date.
- Oversee quarterly goat husbandry training for all recipients at every site.
- Collaborate with other departments to ensure accurate input of goat and family records into FFHC databases on a quarterly basis.

Position overview

As an Agricultural Trainer at Food for His Children (FFHC), you will play a crucial role in equipping goat recipients and project sites with the necessary knowledge and skills to enhance agricultural productivity and sustainability. Your responsibilities will encompass



a wide range of training activities aimed at empowering communities to maximize crop yield and improve farming practices. Additionally, you will collaborate with stakeholders, manage project deliverables, and contribute to program planning and strategy development.

This position requires travel by motorcycle in remote villages. Applicants need a motorcycle license or must be willing to travel by Electric bicycle to complete their duties.

Responsibilities.

- Train and assist goat recipients on how to add value to their crops
- Participate in training of new goat recipients before they are given breeding goats
- Provide training to FFHC project sites based on crops/pests at each site monthly
- Train FFHC families about Moringa Trees, sustainable farming, vertical gardening and other lessons learned from various training such as ECHO
- Provide technical support to farmers on best agricultural practices
- Build capacity of the groups and networks to prepare their operations plans and to coach them on implementation
- Use Foundations for Farming, Farming God's Way, Heifer and other curriculums to help farmers increase their crop yield
- Coordinate with KickStart International for agribusiness training
- Sensitization and mobilization of members and groups
- Organize and direct crop demonstration plots at goat farm as a learning point to goat recipients
- Organize and facilitate farmer field school (open to both goat recipients and others in the community who are not goat recipients) to educate regarding conservation farming technologies Quarterly.
- Organize crop field day so that our goat recipients can learn and exchange new crop technologies
- Ensure implementation, monitoring and evaluation of project deliverables as per project design
- Collaborate with relevant stakeholders (Farmers, Government livestock officers and other NGOs) to ensure appropriate programming strategies are developed and refined for the target population



- Visit target communities on a regular basis to discuss with farmers on their problems, experiences and learn about communities and agricultural practices relevant to the increased production of food for target communities.
- Ensure the design of appropriate training methods and materials for use in local community development work and informal education activities.
- Participate in planning sessions and in the development of program strategies
- Participate in special projects as assigned by the Food for His Children Directors or Managers
- Review performed activities and plan activities for the next week
- Prepare monitoring schedule and indicators to be evaluated
- Evaluate FFHC beneficiaries for changes in their farming practices and production
- Organize and participate in monitoring of the project interventions
- Assist in preparation of yearly AGD Work plan and budget
- Act as a liaison officer between FFHC and crop research findings institutes
- Assist with activities concerning environmental improvement, like tree planting.
- Work closely with other departments as needed to facilitate the development of the FFHC farm
- Manage relationships with relevant stakeholders (local government and other stakeholders)
- Act upon any activity assigned by the office

Position: LIVESTOCK FIELD OFFICER (2)

Reports To Operation Manager

Basic Salary: 775,000/=

Other benefits: Health insurance, airtime and meals/lunch

Position overview

As a Livestock field officer at Food for His Children (FFHC), you will play a vital role in empowering goat recipients and participants with the knowledge and skills necessary for effective animal husbandry practices. Your responsibilities will include conducting training sessions, treatments, providing technical support, coordinating with stakeholders, and ensuring compliance with program requirements.

This position requires travel by motorcycle in remote villages. Applicants need a motorcycle license or must be willing to travel by Electric bicycle to complete their duties.

Responsibilities

- Provide preventative care and treatment to Food for His Children goats and goats in FFHC families' herds
- Read Heifer International's Raising Goats for Milk and Meat and Livestock for a Small Earth and use these as teaching manuals for FFHC recipient and participant training



- Train all FFHC goat recipients and applicants about animal health and husbandry. Assess level of understanding of said training and evaluate progress of goat farmers in practicing proper goat management.
- Train FFHC recipients in basic goat care management to include general health, symptoms of common illness and ways to treat symptoms by using local medical treatments, deworming, dehorning, hoof trimming and teaching when calling a Vet is needed.
- Train FFHC recipients on proper records keeping for milk production, deworming, dehorning, breeding and vaccination and ensure that it is done.
- Maintain the deworming, dehorning, breeding and vaccination records
- At least quarterly, meet with FFHC goat farmers at their homes and at site meetings to provide hands on training and assessment of how they are applying what they have learned, to determine areas where more training is needed and identify leaders in goat farming
- Teach families how to determine if treating a goat is economically viable due to its health or condition and teach the value of each goat
- Disciple, encourage and empower FFHC program participants using appreciative inquiry and Discipleship for Development principles to help FFHC participants and team members learn to solve problems themselves.
- Attend project site meetings as needed and provide training to recipients as required and indicated by annual plan and schedule
- Create an annual training program schedule and calendar for animal husbandry for sites and individual training
- Meet monthly with Operation Manager and Program Coordinator to review progress on training families and how families are doing in relation to goat husbandry and management
- Meet monthly with Agriculture Department members to review goals, scheduled training and action plan items and make adjustments to schedule
- In cooperation with the Program Coordinator, plan, facilitate and organize deworming, dehorning, castration, vaccination, and buck rotation schedules
- Facilitate buck rotation as scheduled each year for the integrity of the program and genetic enhancement.
- Document meetings with FFHC recipients and participants in their file and corresponding record base.
- Support the activities of the government Livestock Officer



- Coordinate with and develop relationships with DLFO and government Livestock Officers and other Livestock Specialists in Karatu District and surrounding areas for collaboration and to seek ways to partner and share knowledge
- Prepare a list of indicators of progress by goat farmers with respect to the care of the project goats
- Provide goat husbandry training for all recipients at least quarterly in every site and twice per year for new recipients
- Create goat husbandry training curriculum with new information for Field Officers to teach at site meetings each month.
- Ensure that all requirements for receiving a goat are met before a recipient is given a goat. This includes an approved shed, proper food supply and recipient contract signed by all required parties. No goat shall ever be given to a family without meeting all the requirements to receive a goat.
- Monitor and evaluate goat recipient activities quarterly, using specific indicators
- Teach Field Officers, new staff and FFHC goat recipients the qualities of good goat sheds and how to perform animal health assessments for "score card" identification during visits to goat recipient families
- Coordinate with the Agriculture Field officer to evaluate progress and discuss training contents and outcome.
- Work with government vets to ensure they are aware of FFHC goats and any problems they can help with and get them involved with providing care for the goats at least quarterly
- Develop a plan to help FFHC families sell their goats for a good price, teach families how to determine the value of a goat they may wish to sell and work with families to help them do so
- Teach families to determine if a goat will be a good breeding goat for milk production based on the buck and dam
- Send required weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual reports for the Agriculture Department to the Operation Manager and DLFO.
- Facilitate the process of supervising and monitoring building demonstration goat sheds and planting fodder trees /grasses at the project farm.
- Coordinate and facilitate the process of survey and purchase goats and pasture/fodder for FFHC breeding goats and goats for recipients
- Attend staff meeting every week and Central Committee meetings as required
- Work closely with other departments as needed to facilitate the development of the FFHC farm



- Assess the quality of Pass On and Pass Back goats and submit the report to Operation Manager at least quarterly
- Attend to sick dairy goats within Food for His Children program, refer for government veterinary officer when necessary

Partner with Government and other development stakeholder

- Develop partnerships & government Vet/Livestock officers who can care for/Assist FFHC goats
- Cooperate with government veterinarians in control and prevention of diseases.
- Cooperate and coordinate with government veterinarians in the area of livestock projects.
- Work with ministry partners to promote community development and sustainability of village goat projects
- Attend government meetings
- Invite government livestock officers to quarterly meetings to discuss FFHC training provided to families, common illnesses occurring and ways to collaborate.
- Ensure government DLFO office & Livestock Specialists are provided with FFHC training syllabus so they are aware of training provided.

Position: FARM MANAGER (1)

Position overview

The Farm Manager oversees all operations at Food for His Children Farm and Innovation Center, managing livestock, agriculture, and tourism activities with a multifaceted approach that includes agricultural management, livestock breeding, and sustainable farming practices.

They coordinate breeding programs for dairy goats and crop production activities, employing innovative techniques to address food scarcity and climate change challenges. Additionally, they manage tourism initiatives to promote agro-tourism and provide hands-on learning experiences for community members, students, and tourists.

In collaboration with community members and stakeholders, the Farm Manager conducts training sessions in various areas such as animal husbandry and agriculture contributing to capacity building and community empowerment. They ensure the health and well-being of farm animals by ensuring they are provided with veterinary care services and play a crucial role in resource management, monitoring farm activities, and maintaining compliance with health and safety regulations.

The Farm Manager builds positive relationships with the local community and government agencies, optimizing farm operations and implementing environmental improvement initiatives. This position requires onsite personnel to ensure adherence to project goals, ultimately contributing to Food for His Children's mission of poverty alleviation and sustainable community development.

Responsibilities.

• Supervise the day-to-day operations of the Food for His Children Farm and Innovation Center, including livestock management, agriculture, and tourism activities.



- Coordinate breeding programs for dairy goats to improve herd genetics and productivity.
